After the Great War had ended in 1918, "The Cardinal" noted in its support for the League of Nations: "The future peace of the world rests with us, every individual one of us. If we can learn that degree of self-control where desire for the good of mankind will overcome the appeals to self-interest, greed and unscrupulous ambition, then we shall have peace. If not, it is war." The next decade would show how prophetic "The Cardinal" writer was.

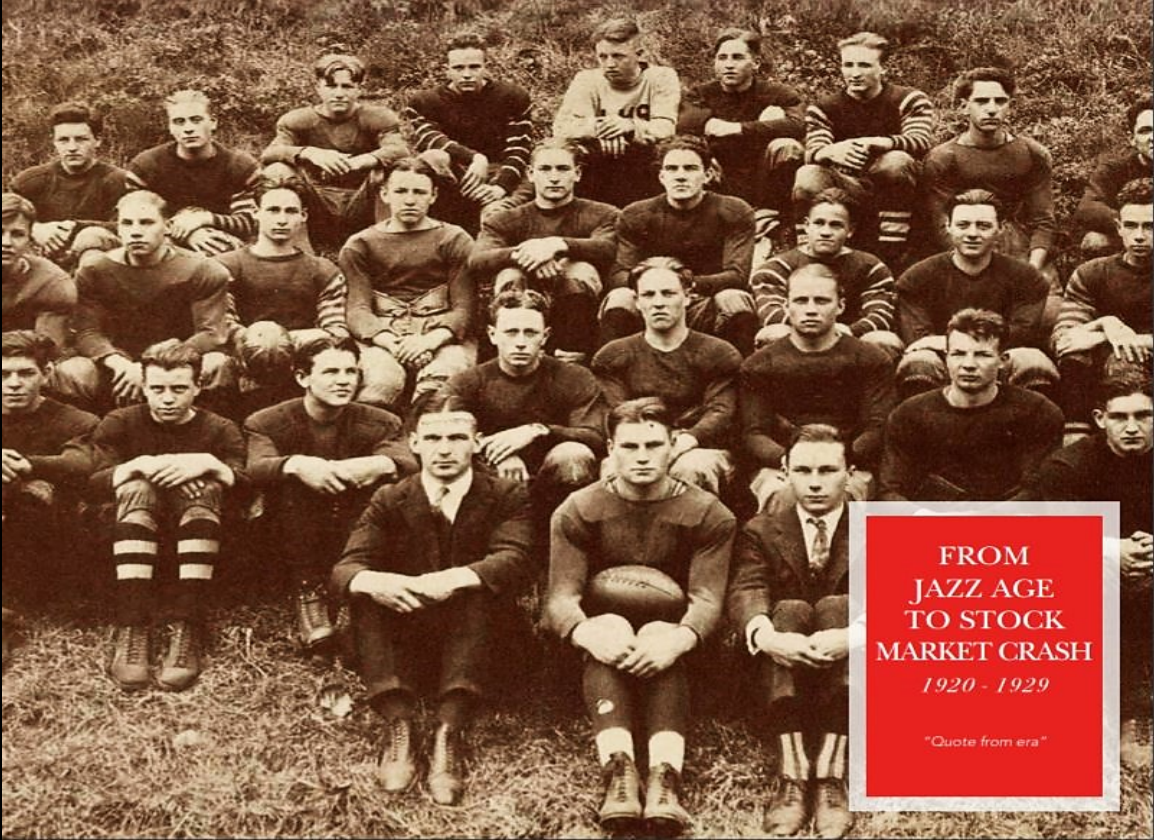


**TIMELINE**

**1917**  
United States enters the Great War. Over 1000 students, graduates, teachers enlist.  
"The Cardinal" calls for all-out support of war effort.  
Students begin campaigns to buy and sell Liberty bonds, saving stamps.  
Bolshevik Revolution topples Russian monarchy.  
Congress approves Constitutional amendment to ban alcohol.

**1918**  
Student group forms to promote academic excellence.  
Basketball team wins city championship.  
Spanish flu epidemic begins worldwide.

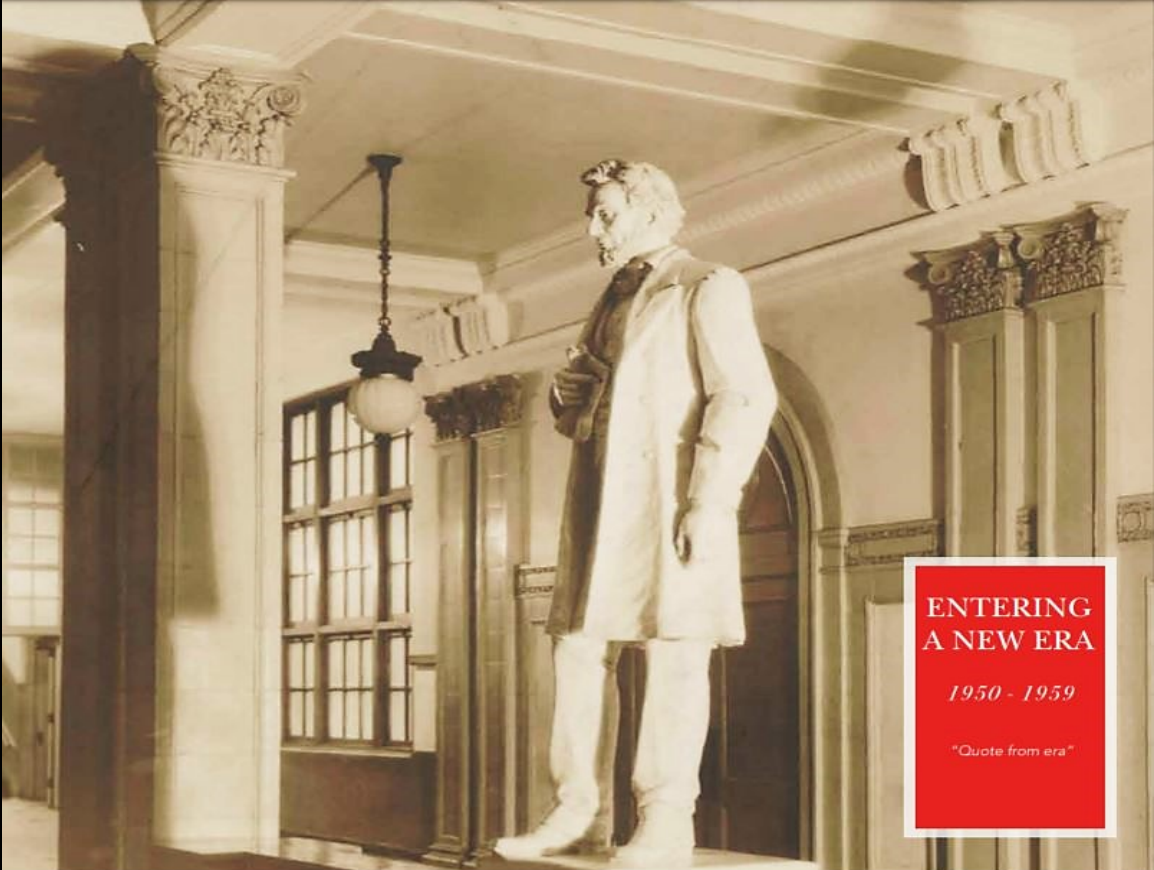
**1919**  
Baseball, basketball teams win city championships.  
Basketball team wins state championship.  
Spanish influenza epidemic causes school board to delay graduation exercises for January classes.  
Lincoln teachers form city-wide group to promote proper hygiene for students, parents to combat flu.  
States approve 18<sup>th</sup> amendment banning alcohol.  
"The Cardinal" hails end of the Great War, cautions against spread of "Bolshevism."

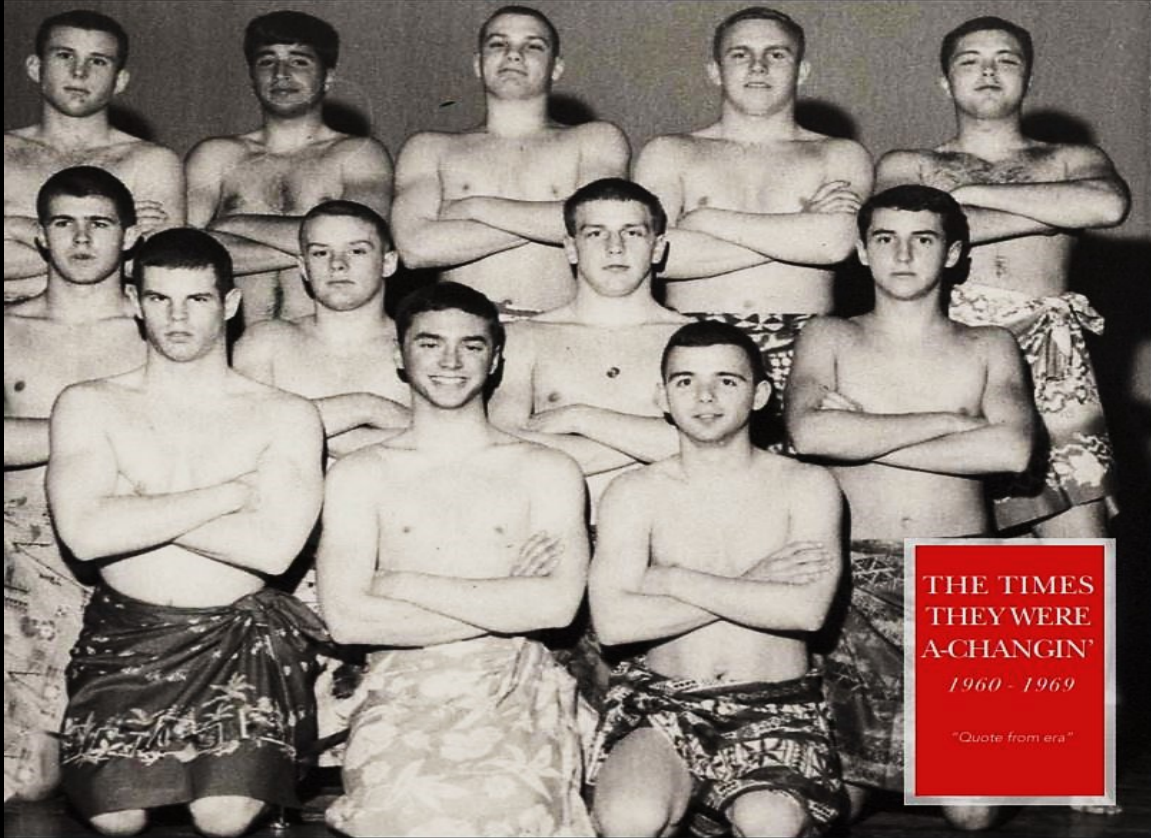
